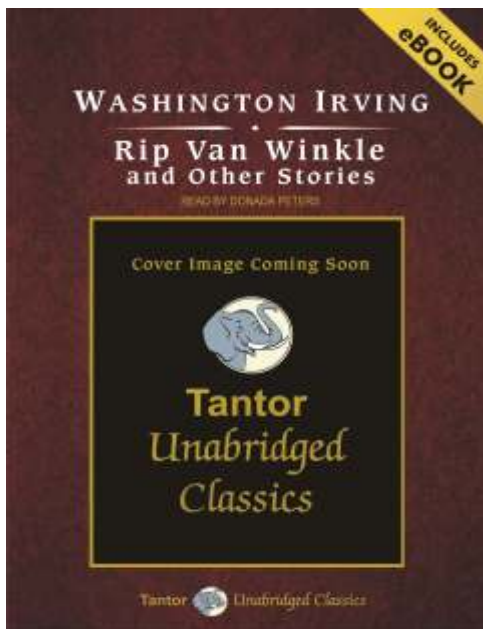

Washington Irving (1783–1859) was an American author, short story writer, essayist, poet, travel book writer, biographer, and columnist. He is best known for writing the stories “Rip Van Winkle” and “The Legend of Sleepy Hollow.” Early on, he was a contributor to the *Morning Chronicle*, published *Salmagundi*, and served as editor of *Analectic* magazine in Philadelphia and New York.

Donada Peters is one of *AudioFile* magazine’s Golden Voices and has won over a dozen *AudioFile* Earphones Awards. As an award-winning narrator, Donada has recorded more than 500 titles, including *Peter Pan* by J. M. Barrie.

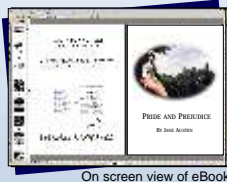
